Community Fire Refuges and Neighbourhood Safer Places – Bushfire Places of Last Resort

These locations may provide some protection from direct flame and heat from a fire, but do not guarantee safety. The refuges and Neighbourhood Safer Place are not alternatives to planning to leave early or to stay and defend your property; they are a place of last resort if all other fire plans have failed. They are not an appropriate destination when leaving the area early nor are they a place of shelter from other types of emergencies (e.g. to escape rising floodwaters or severe weather events).

It may be treacherous reaching these "places of last resort" due to smoke, fire and traffic. There is little cover or protection at the Warburton Recreation Reserve (Footy Oval). It is advised to wear long sleeved cotton or wool clothes and use a dry woollen blanket to protect from radiant heat.

Emergency services are unlikely to be present at these locations during an emergency and your survival during a bushfire is not guaranteed.


Why is Warburton at Risk from Bushfires?

- Climate Change is making our summers hotter, last longer and our forests drier.
- Thick, fire prone vegetation throughout our valley.
- One road ((Warburton Hwy) in and out of town that can be easily blocked by fallen trees.
- Frequent power outages.
- Unreliable phone coverage especially during times of high demand.
- In a fire, the chances of the town being cut off with limited external support and disruption to services is high.
- Mains water pressure may fail in an emergency.

Fire Danger Ratings tell you how dangerous a fire could be if one started.

They are important because they help you decide what actions to take to protect yourself and others from bushfires and grassfires.

A new Fire Danger Rating system was introduced in 2022 across Australia so whether you're at home or traveling, you will see the same rating system.



There are four levels of fire danger in the new system:

- Moderate** Plan and prepare
- High** Be ready to act
- Extreme** Take action now to protect your life and property
- Catastrophic** For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas



Community Alert Siren (Warburton)

Community alert sirens are used as part of Victoria's warning system for emergencies – including flood, fire and storm. Community alert sirens are only used when there is imminent threat to the community.

- Extended Siren (5 minutes) – indicates that a current emergency has been identified in the local area and people should seek further information immediately. The emergency incident will impact people in this area.
- The siren in Warburton is tested for 20 seconds the first Sunday of every month at 9.30AM. It may not be heard by everyone in the area.

- Review your plan annually and share with neighbours, friends and family.
- Your safest option is to always leave early on days of elevated fire danger or if there is a possibility of pending danger.
- In an emergency, if you have time, check on neighbours particularly those less mobile.
